Also in April, a young boy walking home from the subway was assaulted by a male stranger demanding his cell phone and taking his bag. Police were called in on all three instances, but no arrests were made. The police said it is not a crime to talk to someone and couldn't take action based solely on that fact.

We recommend everyone exercise heightened vigilance within our neighbourhood and suggest you review street safety with your children and the importance of being aware of their surroundings when walking home. It is not a good idea to walk through the park while talking on the phone or wearing ear buds. It becomes obvious that you are distracted. We also want to remind people that it is a good idea to wear colour or flashing lights at night when walking or running as the valley is very dark. This helps drivers and is a definite safety issue.

Of course 911 is the number for emergencies and please email me a copy of your police concerns. The police reported no break-ins in the Valley that they are aware of this month.
