## **Stormwater Management and Road Improvement Project**

Road reconstruction and Stormwater and Watermain installation in Priority Area A will be getting under way this summer. Councillor Cliff Jenkins will be providing a detailed update to all residents prior to the start of construction which will provide a time line and information on what residents can expect during the construction process. Now that Priority Area A is about to begin we will begin discussions with The City on the plan for Priority Area B and will keep you posted.

The following update on Priority Area A has been provided by Samuel Jebakumar from The City of Toronto:

1. Donino Avenue (south end to the bridge) and Donino Court - Road Reconstruction and Storm sewer and Watermain Installation

Storm sewer, Watermain and Road designs have been completed. Sewer outfall design at the Don River, west of Donino Avenue Bridge, is under way. The location and positioning of this sewer outfall poses some design challenges as expected. TRCA and MOE approval process have been initiated. Tender anticipated by May 2008.

2. Plymbridge Road and Maytree Road - Road Reconstruction and Storm sewer Installation Detail design in progress. This will be a late summer tender. Anticipated tender date will be notified in due course

# 3. Watermain Installation across Don River from Green Valley to St. Margaret's

Design complete. This will be tendered together with Plymbridge and Maytree.

### 4. Forest Glen Crescent, Doncliffe Drive and Mount Pleasant Road -

Road Reconstruction and Storm sewer Installation

Tender package is being reviewed and finalized. MOE approval awaited. Tender by mid May 2008.

#### **Gypsy Moth Infestation**

The Valley has experienced a significant Gypsy Moth infestation over the past few years. Not only is the damage they inflict on trees and shrubs unsightly, it is very hard on plant material if it is attacked several years in a row. The spring is the best time to fight the Gypsy Moth. Egg sacs can easily be removed by hand. The sacs are small (1/4"-1/2" long) irregular, grayish tan ovals. They are usually found on tree bark, behind downspouts and in other slightly hidden locations. Also, Gypsy Moth bands can be put around tree trunks which capture the caterpillars as they climb trees to feed. These bands are effective and can be purchased at Lee Valley and at various garden Centres.

#### **Valley Crime Watch**

Since the last Valley Newsletter, the following incidents have been reported.

.. A home on Donino had a car broken into. Nothing of value was taken, however, this was the second time since December

.. In February on Donwoods Drive, thieves gained entry to a car left packed with items on return from a holiday as the driveway was too icy to move items safely into the house after a severe storm. Thieves took golf, ski and other personal items from luggage as well. It was felt that a waiting car nearby was used to transport all the items.

.. On March 15 during March break someone entered a home on Donwoods Drive by throwing a rock into the rear glass door then proceeded straight to the master bedroom and removed several items of jewellery. The alarm company arrived nine minutes after it was triggered and still someone was able to successfully get in and out. The owners said the snow had not been shoveled after a storm so remember to make these arrangements before travel in the winter. It was obvious that there was no activity at this house by the snow in the driveway.

Several residents have had their vehicles gone through and items stolen from sheds and garages. We encourage residents to be proactive: Always keep vehicles locked and do not keep valuables in your car. Also, if possible, keep cars parked in a garage.
