Community Safety

Over the past few weeks, there have been a number of break-ins in the Valley, reported by neighbours concerned about the safety of our community. I have contacted Officer Howard Clements of 32 Division, who is our liaison with Toronto Police, and he has confirmed that there has been a rash of break-ins in the Valley, and provided additional information and guidance about these. Officer Clements reported that the incidents have been assigned to a major crime detective, who is overseeing the investigation by a group of officers.

Further information on the break-ins: they have happened throughout our neighbourhood, most of these have happened during the day, sometimes when the homeowner was gone for as little as an hour. Most of the entries have been through the back of the house, and the thieves have efficiently ransacked the home looking for cash, jewelry and silver – small items. Even when alarms are on, the perpetrators have managed to leave before the police or security-company arrives.

The people involved in the break-ins are generally well dressed and drive high-end cars to blend into the community. Neighbours have reported seeing a blue grey van in the area around the time of the break-ins, and even more consistently, a black Audi or BMW.

Although the usual recommendation is to call the non-emergency police phone number (416-808-2222), if we see something suspicious, Officer Clements has said that we are to call 911 if we see someone sitting in a black Audi parked in the neighbourhood, and indicate that this has been consistently noted in the break-ins in the Valley.

Thank you to everyone who has contacted Ann to let her know about concerns and ongoing events as they unfold. It has been very helpful. It is dreadful to feel unsafe in our homes; hopefully the police will catch the perpetrators soon. In the meantime, let's continue to exercise caution, arm our house alarms and look out for our neighbours.

Roads Construction Update

Green Valley Road, York Valley Crescent and Old Yonge St

 The City is in the final stage of the negotiation with the Rosedale Golf Club for the acquisition of the easement inside the Golf club. The City has modified the design of the outfall as requested by TRCA and The Golf club.

- The plan is to start the construction of the outfall and the section of the storm sewer inside the Rosedale golf club this winter and finish this work inside the golf club before April 15, 2018.
- The reconstruction of the road and storm sewer is planned to take place from April to September 2018

Brookfield Rd and Donino Avenue

- The City is in the process of updating and submitting to MOECC the Environmental Assessment of the Hogg's Hollow area done in 2005 in order to consider changes in the layout of the proposed storm sewer that includes a section of the storm sewer that goes from the Brookfield Park to Plymbridge Cres.
- It is estimated that the MOECC review process will take several months.
- The reconstruction of the road and storm sewer is currently planned to take place from April to September 2019. The YMVA Board is working with the City to ensure that traffic calming measures are built into the plan, at the time of construction.
